

Amphitheatre

The Ignacy Jan Paderewski Amphitheatre is the largest roofed facility of its kind in Poland. It is also the city's unique architectural "showcase". Every year, the Amphitheatre hosts numerous events, including the "Kabareton" comedy festival, the "Generacja" rock festival, the "Ulica Smaków" (Flavour Street) culinary festival, concerts, stand-ups, food truck rallies or cinema on deckchairs. ck105.koszalin.pl/amfiteatr



Green Koszalin

Koszalin is a true oasis of nature, with green areas covering nearly 40% of the city's area. Each year, the abundance of species of local fauna and flora allows the city to claim a spot as one of the greenest cities in Poland. The historic Park im. Książąt Pomorskich (Park of the Pomeranian Dukes) located in the city's center enchants with its beauty. Unique tree species, numerous alleyways, fountains and the Swan Island welcome visitors to the site at any time of the year. Koszalin is also home to protected areas and nature reserves: Lubiatowskie Lake Reserve, Bielica Reserve and the "Wąwozy Grabowe" Nature and Landscape Complex.




Chełm Hill

The largest forest complex in the Koszalin city area. The tallest peak is Krzyżanka at 136.2 m above sea level. On the top of the hill, there is the Sanctuary of Our Lady of the Threefold Preciousness and a 31.5 m tall observation tower. After reaching the top of the tower, you can see the town's panorama all the way to the Baltic Sea. Numerous hiking trails pass through Góra Chełmska, including the Tatra Loop Trail or the Pomeranian Route of St. Jacob. At its foot is a Rope Park and Picnic Park. Góra Chełmska is one of the locals' favourite holiday destinations.





Visit Koszalin





Its unique location between the Baltic Sea and the lakes, as well as its extensive green areas, make Koszalin the perfect place for leisure activities in any season. Koszalin is a city of many possibilities, combining rich history with modern infrastructure, and a diverse range of cultural and sporting activities.



Old Town Tourist Route

A tourist trail, facilitating the exploration of the city's history. The historic sites, marked by the Old Town Route sign, are easiest to visit on foot or by bicycle, as most of them are located in the city centre. The most valuable monument is the cathedral from the early 14th century. Noteworthy sites include Pałac Młynarza (the Miller's Palace), currently serving as a museum, and the remains of the city ramparts from the turn of the 12th and 14th centuries located nearby. Walking along the walls you can reach the 15th century Executioner's House, which is now the seat of the "Dialog" Theatre.

Jamno Homestead

A complex of typical 19th century architecture of the surrounding area. The Jamna Homestead is a fascinating centre in Pomerania's folk culture. It depicts the most interesting facets of Jamno's material culture, rituals and art. The homestead has been reconstructed based on the original plans and using authentic materials. The site hosts periodic fairs, workshops and activities for children and adults. While in Jamno, it is also worth visiting the Church of Our Lady of the Rosary. This Gothic church is one of Koszalin's oldest and most valuable monuments.

Cycling in Koszalin

The city has over 100 km of bicycle paths and routes. Koszalin is second in Poland in terms of the number of bicycle paths, considering the ratio of inhabitants per 1 m of bicycle infrastructure (according to portalsamorządowy.pl). Nearly the entire city of Koszalin can be cycled through, thanks to an excellently developed network of bicycle paths. The city operates a bicycle rental system - Koszaliński Rower Miejski (En-Koszalin Municipal Bicycle).
